Students in each grade remain with a single teacher during school hours. Some classrooms may have an individual aide providing support as well. Parents and visitors are not allowed without an appointment. Volunteers are not being accepted at this time. Schedules for recess and lunch run throughout most of the day to minimize instances in which different stables would be in the vicinity of others. The play area has been divided into four sections, with each stable being assigned times during the day so that their outside activity time does not overlap with other stable sin their designated area. These practices have been successful in reducing interaction or amongst stables, limiting exposure to anyone outside of a stable to a negligible amount.

A total of nine stables have been created at Shiloh School These stables operate independently with anywhere from 17-25 total students and staff in each group, most being twenty or less.
